A Double Crostic is two puzzles in one. The main set of clues are answered in horizontal rows, once those have been solved, the answer to the bonus clue appears in the bold vertical column. Hints have been provided in the form of a letter in each word to help you along. Read the Bonus Crostic Clue first; if you know the answer to this, write it in the vertical bold boxes and this will give you additional letter hints for the crosswise clues.

A Note to Parents: Some of the clues are fairly easy to solve, while others will be harder. Youngsters may need help in answering them which makes this a perfect family activity and a great learning opportunity to have a discussion about some of these complex topics

Bonus Crostic Vertical Clue
